Mustangs take 2nd in 1st competition

The Marching Mustangs Band of Downers Grove South High School finished 2nd in their first competition of the season recently in Lake Park.

Ten bands competed in this year's Lancer Band Joust, coming from as far away as Flushing, MI. The Marching Mustangs performed an original routine written by band director Alan Roselieb, to the music of "English Folk Song Suite", "I

Go To Rio", "Wachy Dust" and "Don't Cry For Me Argentina".

Seven judges rated the

band's performance on music execution, marching and maneuvering and general effect,

giving the Marching Mustangs a score of 57.5 for a 2nd place trophy in Class AA. Top honors went to St. Laurence High School with a score just 6.95 points higher.

The Marching Mustangs Band is an all-volunteer group of South High school students that rehearse 2 evenings a



Downers Grove South High in band contest

A high school marching band contest featuring 30 marching units from Illinois, Indiana and Michigan will be held Saturday, Oct. 11, at Chicago's Soldier Field.

Preliminary competition is from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. with finals from 6:30 p.m. to 9 p.m.

The contest is a benefit for Chicago Boys' and Girls' clubs, Chicago Park District charities

and participating bands.

Tickets will be \$5 at the gate, and \$4 for students, senior citizens and advance sales. Children 6 years old and under will be admitted free.

DG South band to compete

The Downers Grove South High School band, under the direction of Alan Roselieb, will perform against 29 midwest high school marching bands at Beatrice Music Bowl VII-Illinois Saturday, Oct. 11.

The music bowl program provides fund-raising dollars for the bands and for local charities. This year, net proceeds from the Illinois Music Bowl will be divided among the participating bands, the Chicago boys

and girls clubs and Chicago Park District charities.

The bands are judged by a panel of high school and college music educators. Judging takes place in 3 categories: music performance, marching performance, and overall effect.

Tickets may be purchased by calling 234-9700 or by contacting the participating bands. Admission is \$5 at the gate and \$4 for senior citizens and students.

Mustangs are grand champions

The Marching Mustangs of Downers Grove South High School took top honors recently in band competitions held at Northern Illinois University in DeKalb.

The 125-member band received a score of 88.95 to win 1st place in class AA and to top all bands, regardless of class, for recognition as the Grand Champions.

The Northern Illinois University competition was the band's last competition of the season, having previously competed at the Lancer Band Joust, Lake Park; Illini Marching Band Festival, Champaign; and Tropicana Music Bowl, Chicago.

In addition to field competitions and halftime shows at school football games this year, the band has appeared in the

Lockport "Canal Days" parade and 4th of July parades in both Darien and Downers Grove; the Main st. Re-opening Parade, and the Downers Grove South High School Homecoming Parade.

The Marching Mustangs will be performing their award winning show one more time, Oct. 25, at South high school, during halftime.

Band to hold annual pizza sale



The Marching Mustangs of Downers Grove South High School will be holding their 3rd annual Pizza Day Feb. 21.

The Marching Mustangs of Downers Grove South High School have been invited to participate in the 1987 Aloha Bowl World of Music Festival next December in Honolulu.

In addition to the marching band, the school's jazz band, symphonic wind ensemble and color guard are expected to compete in separate competitions during the 4-day music festival.

Actual competitions for the various groups would be held Dec. 27 and 28 with awards presented at an awards dinner on Dec. 29.

The boosters will be soliciting contributions from area businesses and civic organizations to help assure that the estimated \$145,000 can be raised in the short time available.

The band will be selling Florida Valencia oranges and Indian River red grapefruit with delivery on March 24 or shortly after.

According to Peggy Brinker, Ways and Means coordinator, a choice of 2 carton sizes will be available. A small carton of oranges, selling for \$8 will be offered containing 40 to 50 oranges depending on size.

The large carton, with 80 to 100 oranges, will cost \$14. Grapefruit are priced the same, with the small box of grapefruit containing 16 to 24 and the large box, 32 to 48, depending on size.
