After an opening fanfare of the familiar Chicago melody, the show begins with an arrangement of "Noisy Wheels of Joy," by American composer, Eric Whitacre. The music simulates a ride through Chicago on the famous "L" or elevated trains, including at one point, a stop along the way. The show continues with a nod to the pride of Chicago, it's two baseball teams the Cubs and White Sox.
