February 2, 2005	Open House for Lakeview and Jefferson Students 6:00 pm in Band Room for band students & parents - 7:00 pm in Auditorium for all new students and parents. Course recommendations will be handed out during this event
February 5, 2005	Registration begins at the Junior High Schools with Counselors
February 10, 2005	2005 Marching Mustang Leadership Tryouts – after school All interested students see Mr. Hornish for an application and essay form
February 28, 2005	Marching Mustangs Registration Meeting-7:30pm in Auditorium All interested new and returning students and/or parents should attend All intent forms and deposit will be due by March 15, 2005
February 28 – March 3, 2005	Wind Ensemble/Wind Symphony Auditions-Part I (Scales and Solo) All upper class students interested in enrolling in one of these two classes for the 2005-2006 school year must complete both parts of the audition to be considered
March 14-18, 2005	Freshmen Auditions at each Junior High Each student will be heard individually by one of our three directors. Enrollment in Concert Band I,Concert Band II,Symphonic Band, or possibly Wind Symphony will be determined by these auditions and your Junior High Band Director's recommendation. Enrollment in Wind Symphony for freshmen will also be considered if instrumentation requirements are not satisfied with upper class students.
March 15, 2005	General Registration packets will be mailed out All new and returning students will receive this registration packet in the mail. All forms and voluntary Booster membership fee will be due by April 15, 2005
April 18-22, 2005	Wind Ensemble/Wind Symphony Auditions-Part II (Etudes & Sight Reading)
April 25, 2005	Final course Recommendation submitted to the Guidance Office
June 28, 2005	2005 Marching Mustang Season Begins (more details at Feb. 28 meeting)
Sept. 1-7, 2005	Auditions for Jazz Ensemble and Jazz Lab Band All interested students may enroll in Jazz Ensemble or Jazz Lab Band with their counselor. Registration will be finalized based on auditions during the first week of Classes. All students wishing to audition should attend class from 7:00 – 7:50 am, beginning Aug. 31 for upper classmen and Sept. 1 for freshmen

Market Day News

We have been doing so well this year. We have made lots of profit to help our band students with their accounts. It is an easy way to get extra money for your son and daughter. Just place an order (and have your friends order) and at the end of the ordering process send a message to the chair with your child's name on the line. Then he or she will get at least 10% of your (or your friend's) order. Our next Market Day is February 12th. Order by noon on Wednesday, February 9th. We have had fantastic volunteer help for the sale. Come at 8 AM on Saturday and help unload and set up. Our volunteers get to fill their orders first!

Lou and Darlene Bedoe and I have seniors so we will need replacements. We'd love to be able to train our new replacements during the April Market Day. In order to help you decide if this is a job for you, I have included a job description. The job can be split between two people like we have done or it can be just one person. Besides the main task of organizing the June, July, and August Market Days (which are the sole responsibility of the band) and making sure everything goes smoothly the day of the sale (3 hours per month for 8 months per year), there are a few hours behind the scene. Once in a while, especially during the summer there are paper orders to input on the computer web site (just like the way we put our own orders in). Then there is the computer program that Lou uses to credit each students account. It is a very easy Excel type program that almost any one could learn quickly and it does not take a lot of time per month. So all in all, it is less than 10 hours per month that one would spend on Market Day as chairperson. Please contact Lou, Darlene, or I for more information.






Student Account Info

A student account is created for every band program student. It works like a piggy bank, in that each student can get money credit to the account, and can take money out of the account to pay for band related expenses. As a participating band program student, whenever you participate in many of the Mustang Band fundraisers, the amount that you earn (a percentage of the profit) is placed in your account. As you participate in more fundraisers, monies are added to your account.

Craig has located VHS tapes of the band from the 1990s. As time permits these will be made into digital videos and posted on the web site.
