FOFA

Choir Boosters thanked families who participated in the Cozy Corner fundraiser weekend. FOFA will be looking for volunteers to help during the holiday art show and also for a variety of tasks for the Holiday concert. A Sign Up Genius link will be sent out soon.

Order forms for the Poinsettia sales will also be coming out soon. Plants sell for \$12 and students can earn \$4 per plant after the sale of their first plant.

This year the sale of note cards and calendars will be replaced by the sale of insulated tumblers with inserts of original artwork.

Marching Band

The Marching Mustangs finished their season in record breaking style and a celebration of all of the hard work and success of the Marching Band will take place this Thursday at the banquet.

Music Bowl was a great success. Despite the new parking lot layout and ongoing construction, the event went smoothly. Thank you to Cinda Lester and Melissa Melendez for taking on this huge project so successfully. According to the bylaws; Music Bowl chairs should be officially appointed this month and should assume office by December 1st.

We are looking to change how we ask volunteers to sign up for Marching Band events. We seem to have more people riding to shows on school buses than were needed. We are looking at having bus chaperones double as pit crew or uniform helpers and will attempt to re-establish the rule that only those who signed up as volunteers can ride the buses. Connie Vanni has volunteered to head this up and is looking into using a different sign up platform that will give us more flexibility when it comes to emails.

Concert and Jazz Bands

Concert season starts on Wednesday, November 6th. A concert with performances by all three Jazz Ensembles will kick things off followed by the Wind Ensemble Invitational on November 12th and a concert with CB, SB and WS on November 14th. This year WE will be joined by Eisenhower and Lakeview Junior High Schools.

We are looking for volunteers to take over hospitality for concert and jazz bands. These people are needed to coordinate the small refreshment reception that happens after every student concert. If you have ideas about who might be willing to take this on please let me know. There was some discussion about not continuing to host a reception for future concerts, as it is difficult to find volunteers.

Miscellaneous, Unfinished and New Business

In an attempt to make the best decision about Charms and whether or not to replace it can those of you who use it as a way to complete a booster related task please indicate what you use it for and what it is about Charms in particular that is important to the task you do. We will

find a date at the end of January or beginning of February to meet and discuss our options so we can make a decision about what the best course of action is for our organization.

This year's senior class has provided us with a large group of very involved parents all of whom will need to be replaced. We are in need of a considerable number of new Booster executives, coordinators and Music Bowl chairs for next year. Quite a few of these roles would benefit hugely from having a shadow to ensure a smooth transition. VI. VP of Music Bowl (Cinda Lester and Melissa Melendez):

Expenses

\$20,500, based on our unofficial numbers. We saved approximately \$3000 through donated items and time. We should make sure to plan for these expenses in future years, in case donations are not available in the future. Income not yet determined. Given that we were at 70% of the number of band students as last year, and it was cold, we are hoping that our profit is somewhere between 50-70% of last year's total.

Programs / Sponsors / Advertisers

Our income was higher than last year, so thank you to everyone who found folks to donate. The program sales generally only break even, which is about where we were this year.

T-shirts

We made \$526 income from those sales (10% of total sales). Nearly 1/3 of total sales were to our students ahead of time, the rest were sold at the event. We think this was definitely worthwhile, and we should pursue again. Note: Bob will give us 10% of ALL sales, so we may want to consider switching all spirit wear, warmups, show shirts, etc. to his shop?

Golf carts

We made due with only 3 carts, and probably would have been fine with 3 working carts. Given that the 2 battery powered carts were dead most of the day, we struggled. Not sure if it would be worthwhile to spend money on rented carts, if we (again) can't find donated carts next year.

Shadows

We know there are MANY senior parent committee chairs, and we hope you had an opportunity to have a shadow, or train someone new how to do your job next year. Hopefully you can have someone lined up from this year's crew to take over your spot next year. Thank you again for your 4+ years of service to the Boosters.

Emergency

The gentleman who had a heart attack just before the final awards announcement is doing well, and his family has shared nothing but praise for everyone involved in getting him help, and getting his family safely on their way to the hospital following the ambulance.
