

School District 99 program honored

No matter what day of the week it is, the halls are often alive with the sound of music at Downers Grove North and South high schools.

So maybe that is why Community High School District 99 was awarded the second-ever Outstanding Total Music Program Award by the Illinois Music Educators Association.

The award is given "in recognition of school districts that maintain (quality) music programs - performing as well as

non-performing."
According to Diane Hires, head of the district's music department, the breadth of musical offerings at both high schools is what sets the program apart from the others.

She said many schools will sacrifice certain portions of their music programs to strengthen other areas. In other words, a school may have a strong orchestra while its band and chorus programs suffer.

But that has not been the case in District 99, where many of the 800 musical students participate in more than one music

program.

The reason for the success, she says, is the dedicated career staff in the district. Both band directors, Alan Roselieb at South and Lance Schulz at North, have both been with the district for over 30 years. Hires herself has been with the district for 20 years.

"It takes decades to build a

tradition, not two or years, and I think a lot of people don't realize that," she said: "I don't think it has anything to do with the budget or the facilities. We just try to make the best of what we have."

District 99's orchestra is also a strong point of the music program because many other schools have dropped their orchestras over the past 15 years, according to Hires. Patrick Anello directs orchestras at both schools and combines the two for performances.

Both schools also have bands that travel. "The trips have been an important part of the energy building in band," Hires

Non-performing music courses, such as music theory, rock and jazz listening classes and guitar, are also offered. Students also can learn to play instruments while in high school.

"There are people for whom performance is not right,' Hires said. "But a lot of us are going to be listeners for the rest of our lives."

The district will officially receive the award in January.

Other music staff members include Laura Nichols, choral director; Craig Roselieb, choral and band director; James Arns Jr. and Lois Nelson, accompanists; and secretaries Loretta Walton and Beth Nielsen.

The Marching Mustangs Band Boosters Organization Parent Committee awarded four scholarships to band members at Downers Grove South High School.



Scholarship winners are chosen by the band director and staff.




