



JUDGING PROCESS

How the Bands are Judged

The **2023 Marching Mustang Music Bowl** will utilize the Bands of America System and Judges Sheets. Of the seven judges in the six categories listed below, two judges will evaluate Music General Effect, and one for each of the other five categories. In addition, we will provide comments, scores and caption awards for Outstanding General Effect, Best Auxiliary, and Best Percussion. These scores will not be considered in the placement of the bands. Our judging panel's credentials are listed in the following pages of this program and incorporate a wide variety of backgrounds and expertise from academic and drum corps arenas.

Music Categories

Music Execution Individual – Done by a judge at the field level that is listening for the individual performance level of the band members from a musical standpoint. Qualities including intonation, articulation, rhythmic and pitch accuracy, and dynamic response will be considered. This score is averaged with the Music Execution Ensemble score to comprise 20% of the total score.

Music Execution Ensemble – Done by a judge in the press box that is listening for the total group and section performance levels of the band members from a musical standpoint. Qualities including intonation/blend, articulation, rhythmic alignment, balance, and dynamic response will be considered. This score is averaged with the Music Execution Individual score to comprise 20% of the total score.

Music General Effect of the entire ensemble (brass, woodwind and percussion) is evaluated by two judges at press box level in the categories of repertoire, staging and showmanship. This category takes into account not only how effective the music sounds to the listener, but how it is incorporated into the visual presentation by both the entire ensemble to bring about the highest effect to the audience. The points of each judge are added together to comprise 40% of the total score.

Visual Categories

Visual Execution Individual – Done by a judge at the field level that is watching for the individual performance level of the band and color guard members from a physical and visual standpoint. Qualities including posture, foot technique, tempo maintenance, form and interval awareness and showmanship will be considered. This score is averaged with the Visual Execution Ensemble score to comprise 20% of the total score.

Visual Execution Ensemble – Done by a judge in the press box that is watching for the total group and section performance levels of the band and color guard members from a visual standpoint. Qualities including form, staging and field coverage, transition and showmanship will be considered. This score is averaged with the Music Execution Individual score to comprise 20% of the total score.

Visual General Effect of the entire ensemble including color guard is evaluated by one judge at press box level in the categories of design and coordination. The degree to which the visual design effectively represents the music, and how these are coordinated is the principal concept of this category. These points comprise 20% of the total score.

Other Considerations

The timing judge on the field instills the discipline of marching band competition to keep the entire show moving and executed according to schedule. Bands are required to perform a minimum of seven and a maximum of eleven minutes.

JUDGES

Jesse Backes....

Jesse Backes has been a member of the educational team at The Cavaliers since 2017 and is the percussion director at Fishers High School in Fishers, Indiana. He spent many years with the Cavaliers Indoor Percussion, Phantom Regiment, and has served dozens of scholastic and independent ensembles around the country as an educator, arranger, and consultant for the last 10 years.

Justin Clintsman....

Justin Clintsman is a designer, adjudicator and choreographer that's based in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Focusing on the visual artistry across central midwest, he has had a hand in the success of many high schools, collegiate marching band and winterguard (Carroll University Marching Pioneers) as well as Drum Corps such as (River City Rhythm, Pioneer and Kilties). He has performed with Star United, Blue Stars, Phantom Regiment and CWi Winterguard. Justin aspires to invest in every area of the marching arts and values the individual's growth no matter the skill level or background. Justin has judged and has been apart of WSMA in Wisconsin and Festivals of Music within the midwest.

Dean DeKemper

Dean DeKemper, from Salem, Indiana, is a fifteen-year member of the Tri-State Judges Association, specializing in General Effect, Visual Performance and Color Guard. He is a former American Musical Ambassador, a Charter and three-year performing member of the Star of Indiana Drum and Bugle Corps of Bloomington, Indiana, a Drum Corps Midwest All-Star Corps member, former Visual Coordinator for Evansville Central High School, and former Visual Caption Head for Ubiquity Winterguard, a consistent Tri-State Marching Arts Finalist Medalist and Winter Guard International Regional Finalist Medalist. He was formerly the Director of Pep Band at the University of Southern Indiana. He has consulted with many outstanding high school and independent programs in Indiana and Kentucky and has adjudicated marching bands, winter guards and drum lines throughout the United States. He is a twenty-eight year Early Intervention Specialist and System Supervisor for First Steps, Indiana's Early Childhood Development Intervention Program, holds a Bachelor of Science in Education from the University of Southern Indiana and is a certified LifeCourse Ambassador.

Alex Kaminsky

Alex Kaminsky is Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music at VanderCook College of Music in Chicago. He holds degrees from the University of Florida and Indiana University, is active as an adjudicator, and is in demand as a guest conductor and clinician across the country. Prior to coming to VanderCook, Kaminsky's high school bands performed at many prestigious events and national conferences including the American Bandmasters Association, College Band Directors National Association, National Band Association, Music for All National Concert Band Festival, Carnegie Hall, and 4 times at the Midwest Clinic. Professor Kaminsky's marching bands consistently placed in the Florida Marching Band State Championship Finals, winning the FMBC State Championship 4 of his last 6 years as a high school band director, as well as placing in finals at BOA regional competitions.



JUDGES

Sean Kelley

Dr. Sean Kelley is Associate Director of Band, Coordinator of Music Education, and Supervisor of Athletic Bands at North Central College in Naperville, IL. Sean holds degrees in music education from Wittenberg University and the University of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music, and degrees in conducting from Wright State University and the University of Oklahoma. Sean is also the founder and music director of the 85-member professional-level wind band, The Naperville Winds.

Mike Madonia

Mr. Madonia is the director of the College of Lake County Concert band and has served as director of bands at Robert Morris University. He has also been the applied trumpet instructor for South Suburban College, St. Xavier University and College of Lake County. During his tenure at these schools, he simultaneously served as Brass Staff or Caption Head at the following Drum and Bugle Corps.: Pioneer, Spirit of Atlanta, New Jersey Surf, Colts and Kilties. Having taught at the high school level for 36 years, his bands were consistently winning multiple contests throughout the year including Bands of America Summer National Finalist, Bands of America Regional Finalist, Illinois State Marching Band Finalist as well as hundreds of awards for Concert band and Jazz Band. Mr. Madonia serves as chief judge today.

Scott Oliver

Scott Oliver is a graduate of the University of Illinois. He has been a band director at Marian Catholic High School, Metea Valley High School, and is currently a band director at Neuqua Valley High School. Scott was a brass tech with the Madison Scouts from 2010-2014 and brass caption head from 2015-2017.

Pietro Pisello

Pietro Pisello is in his 11th year of music education. He is currently the Director of Bands at Thornton Fractional North High School in Calumet City, Illinois. Previously, he was a band director at Rich Township High School in Matteson and Washington Elementary School in Waukegan. He has served as the Conductor and Artistic Director of the Arlington Heights Community Concert band for the past 2 years.

During his tenure at these schools, his marching, concert, pep and jazz bands have won several awards at festivals including the Chicago Football Classic, Jazz in the Meadows, and IHSA Organizational, Solo and Ensemble, and Pep Band Contests. Several of his students have also been selected to ILMEA District and All State Ensembles.

Pietro graduated from Ridgewood High School in Norridge, IL and then attended Trinity International University in Deerfield, where he received his Bachelor's degree in music education. He received his Masters of Music Education Degree from VanderCook College of Music in 2020. Peter is also active in The Sicilian Band of Chicago where he plays trombone.

He has had the privilege of working with renowned units such as Allegiance Winterguard, Kinetic Winterguard, Novella D Winterguard, Montage Winterguard, Mundelein High School, and Evolution A Winterguard.

In addition to his instructional roles, Bennie Wadlington has emerged as a respected judge within the Midwest Colorguard Circuit. For the past three years, he has lent his critical eye and keen insights to the judging panel, specializing in the evaluation of General Effect. Bennie's discerning judgment and commitment to the marching arts community continue to inspire and elevate the performances of countless individuals and units.

Paul Wiercioch

Paul Wiercioch has been involved in the marching arts since 2001 as a performer, educator, clinical, and adjudicator. Most notably, eleven years over 2007-2018 as a Designer, Manager, and Visual Coordinator of Green Thunder Percussion, and the Independent World Percussion group, Cavaliers Indoor Percussion. Prior to his tenure with Cavaliers Indoor, Mr. Wiercioch was a member of the Cavaliers Drum & Bugle Corps contra section (2001-2004) and visual staff (2011-2013). In addition to his work with the drum corps, Mr. Wiercioch has worked extensively with marching band and winter guard programs throughout the state of Illinois for the past twenty years.

Mr. Wiercioch attended Illinois State University, earning a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration. During the week, he works as a Team lead for Sentinel Technologies, and he lives in Woodridge with his wife Gail and their two kids, Evan and Thea.
